
Improvements

- New park pavilion, benches, tables and restrooms.
- Resurfacing, striping, updating four basketball courts and improving court lighting.
- Constructing walkways and paths
- Covering the performance stage area
- Adding a community information board
- Installing an ADA accessible playground

Need

Impact

The City of Yakima struggles to fund park improvements without community fundraising, grants, and donations. Miller Park, in some areas, is so deteriorated that it has become a safety hazard to this community, making its renovation a priority.



Miller Park in located in NE Yakima. The population in this community is 75% Hispanic. 58% of the families living in the area live below the poverty line. A park renovation will promote community use and deter criminal activity.
